The plans call for an off-stream storage reservoir on either Gallegos or Moncisco wash with a net active storage of 7,735 acre feet. In addition, the Gallegos site would have 3,850 acre feet of sediment storage, 450 acre feet for evaporation and 270 acre feet for seepage for a total storage capacity of 14,542 acre feet and total active capacity of 8,455 acre feet. The Moncisco site would have 1,603 acre feet of sediment storage, and the same evaporation and seepage storage for a total storage of 11,858 acre feet and total active storage of 8,455 acre feet. Final site selection has not been made, but conditions generally favor the Moncisco site.
